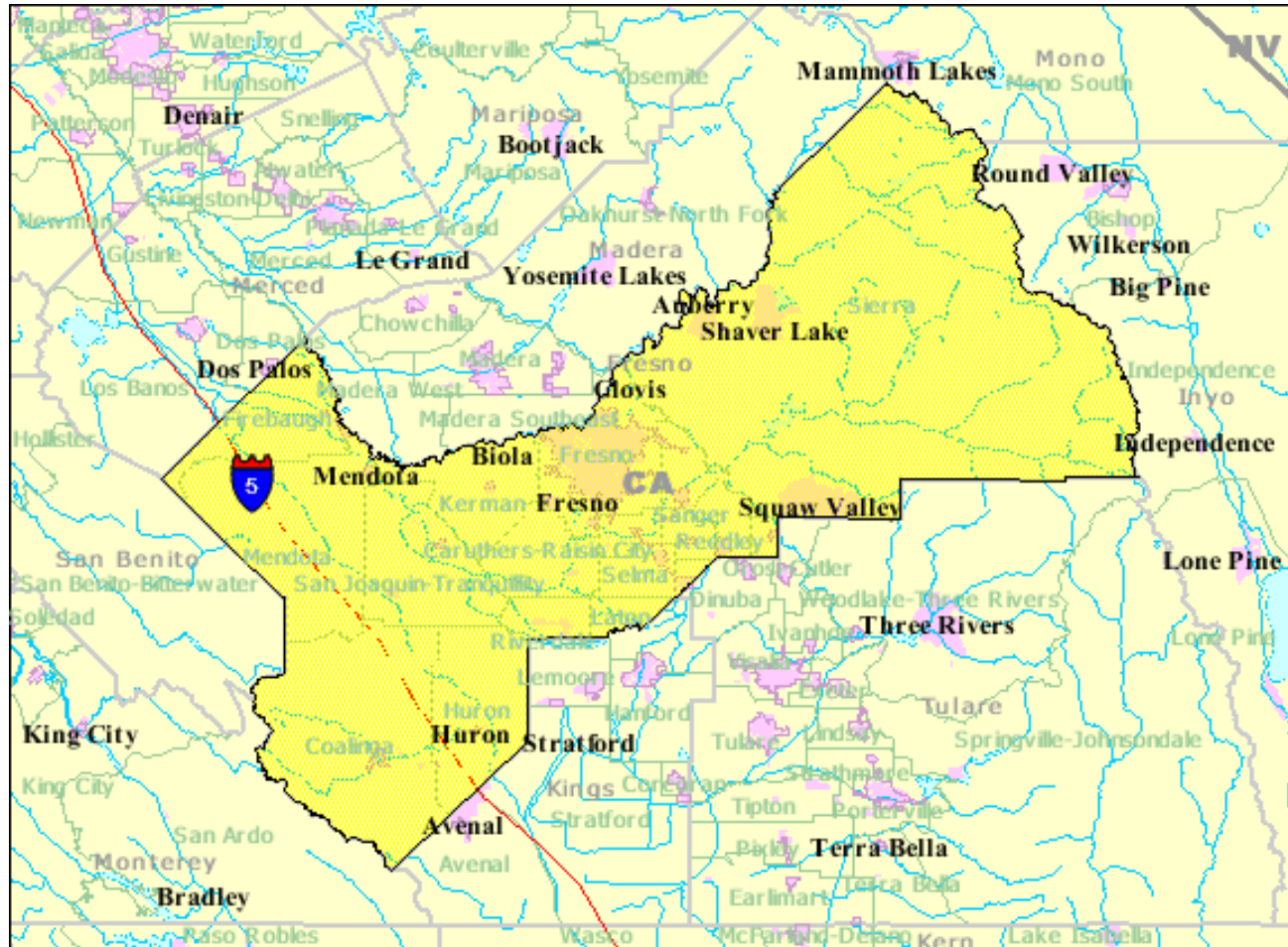

Geography

Fresno County is located near the center of California's San Joaquin Valley, which together with the Sacramento Valley to the north, forms the Great Central Valley; one of the distinct physical regions of the State. The Coast Range foothills, which form the county's western boundary, reach a height of over 4,000 feet near Coalinga while some peaks along the crest of the Sierra Nevada, the county's eastern boundary, exceed 14,000 feet. The valley floor in between is fifty to sixty miles wide and has an elevation near the City of Fresno of about 325 feet. (Environment of Fresno County, Fresno County Planning Dept., 1975).

Rich soil, irrigation and the hard work of farmers who come from all over the world combine to make Fresno County the richest and most productive agricultural county in America. In the year 2000, Fresno County growers grossed over 3.4 billion dollars from the production of more than 200 commercial crops.

The City of Fresno is one of 15 incorporated cities in Fresno County; all are located on the valley floor. Over 60 percent of Fresno County's total population resides in the neighboring cities of Fresno and Clovis.

Climate

Fresno County is subject to a Mediterranean climate. Low elevations are hot and dry in the summer and in the winter moderate temperatures and relatively light precipitation are common.

Temperatures and rainfall for the City of Fresno are typical of that part of the county in which most people live.

Demographics

According to the 2000 Census, Fresno County is one of the largest, fastest growing and most diverse counties in the State of California.

With a population of 823,900 (as of Jan 1, 2001) Fresno County is the 10th largest county, up from its ranking of 12th in 1990. The largest city, Fresno, population 441,200, remains the state's sixth largest city. (Fresno Bee 3/30/01)

In Fresno County, three in five people are either Hispanic or members of a minority race, such as African American, Asian, American Indian or Pacific Islander. (Fresno Bee 3/30/01)

Fresno County is the State's third most diverse county, behind Los Angeles and Alameda Counties. (Fresno Bee 4/1/01)

The Needs Assessment was conducted in accordance with AB2311, which requires each county to "Conduct an assessment of child care needs in the county no less than once every five years," (Section 8499.3 of the Education Code). The Education Code defines those factors which must be included in the assessment of child care needs. The sections of this report represent those factors. Therefore, this report meets the requirements of AB2311 and Education Code Section 8499.3.

The data reported in this document is a summary of information regarding the need for child care in Fresno County. The data is reported in two documents as follows:

1. Executive Summary, which provides highlights of the report, focusing on those areas (zip codes) with the greatest need. The Executive Summary includes highlights only.
2. Data for all zip codes may be found in the Fresno County Child Care Needs Assessment Report.

Data in both reports is reported in frequency counts rather than percentages. This was the preference of the Fresno County Child Care & Development Local Planning Council (LPC) Child Development Task Team and the evaluator. In a preliminary report, the results were presented in both formats (i.e., counts and percentages). It was clear from the analysis that reporting the results in percentage format resulted in a distorted portrait of the needs associated with child care throughout Fresno County. Thus, it was decided to report data in frequency count format.

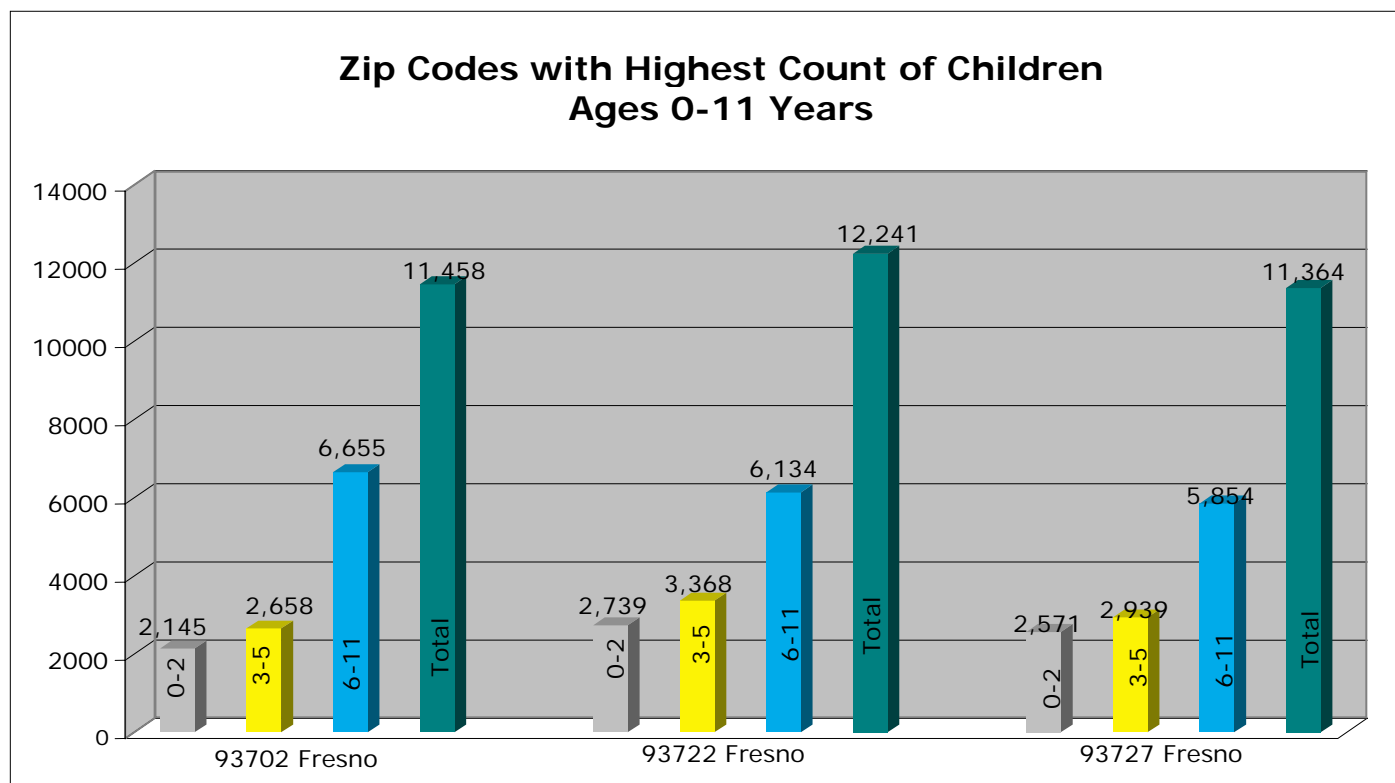
The data in this report was derived from multiple sources. The source of data for each variable is reported. The criteria for each data source was that each were to provide recent, comprehensive and fair information regarding child care needs in Fresno County for each zip code. Source(s) of data are provided so program managers, developers and grant writers may obtain more up-to-date information. These are not static numbers, but change daily based on the increasing population and changing characteristics of Fresno County. Therefore, the source of data and websites are essential so that the most recent data can be used in writing proposals and creating programs.

Number of Children Age 0-11 Years in Fresno County by Zip Code

According to the 2000 U.S. Census, there were 30,349 children age 0-2 years, 34,160 age 3-5 years and 75,878 age 6-11 years in Fresno County in the year 2000. The total number of children age 0-11 years in Fresno County in 2000 was 140,387.

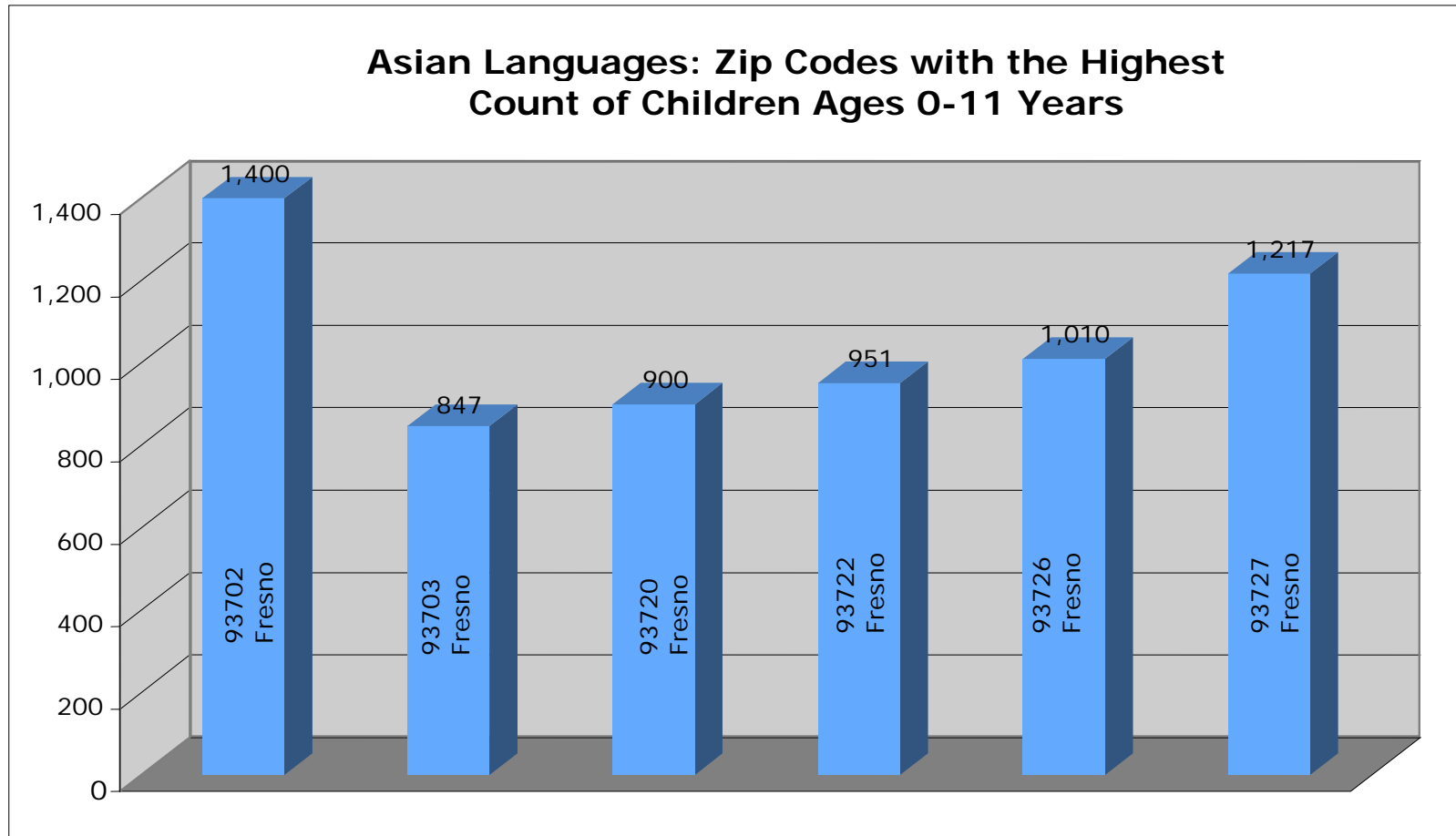
The following graph illustrates the three zip codes in Fresno County with the greatest number of children in 2000. These are presented for illustrative purposes only. Data for all zip codes in Fresno County may be found in the accompanying report entitled Number of Children Age 0-11 Years in Fresno County by Zip Code. Since data throughout this report is presented in frequency count format (as opposed to percentage format) the number of children per zip code is important in determining the baseline count for each zip code. It is important if program developers or grant writers wish to compute a percentage value for any variable.

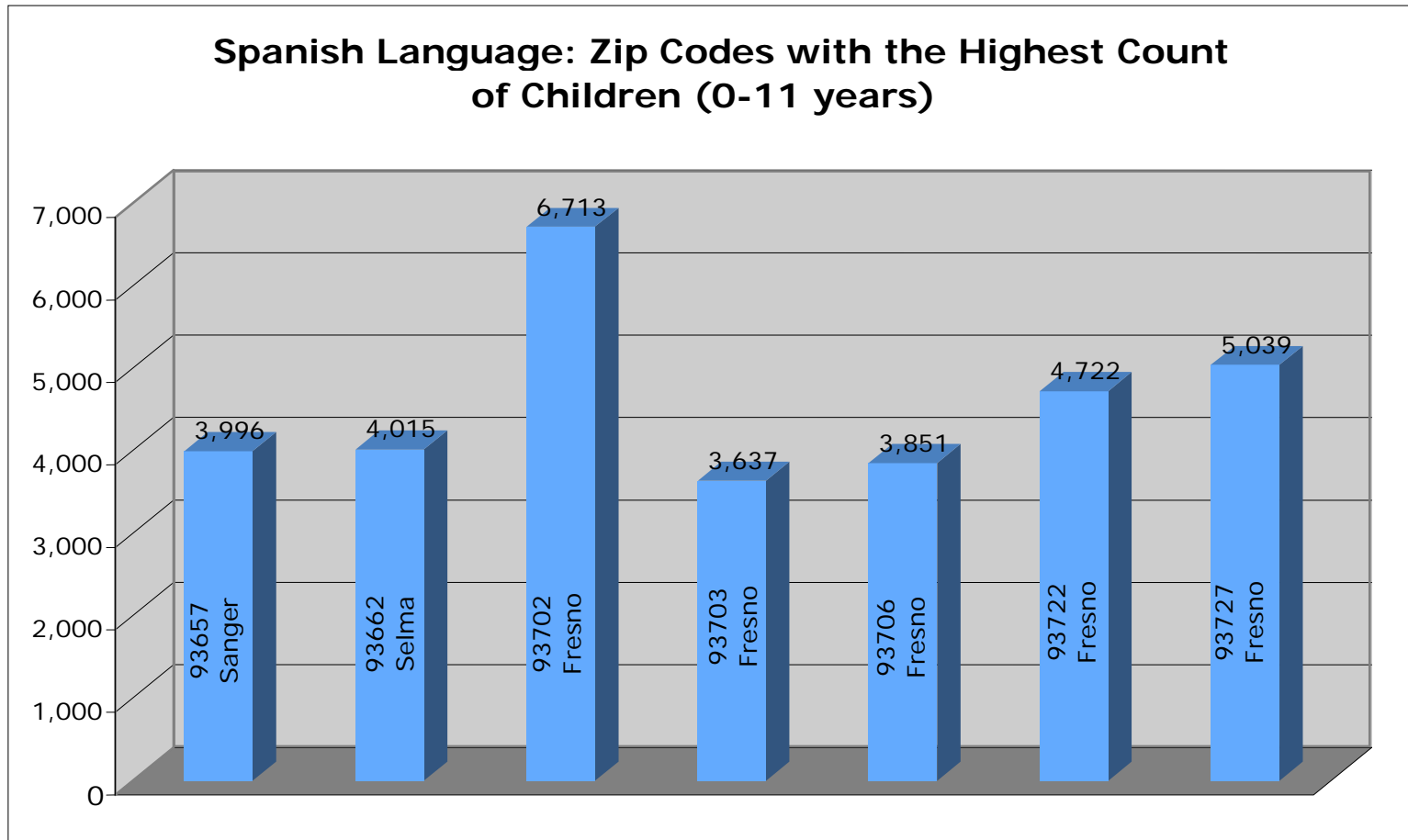
Primary Household Languages

The number of children from non-English language households is significant in Fresno County. According to the 2000 U.S. Census, there were 250,903 households in Fresno County in the year 2000. Approximately 59% were classified as English-speaking households, 32% Spanish and 5% Asian. 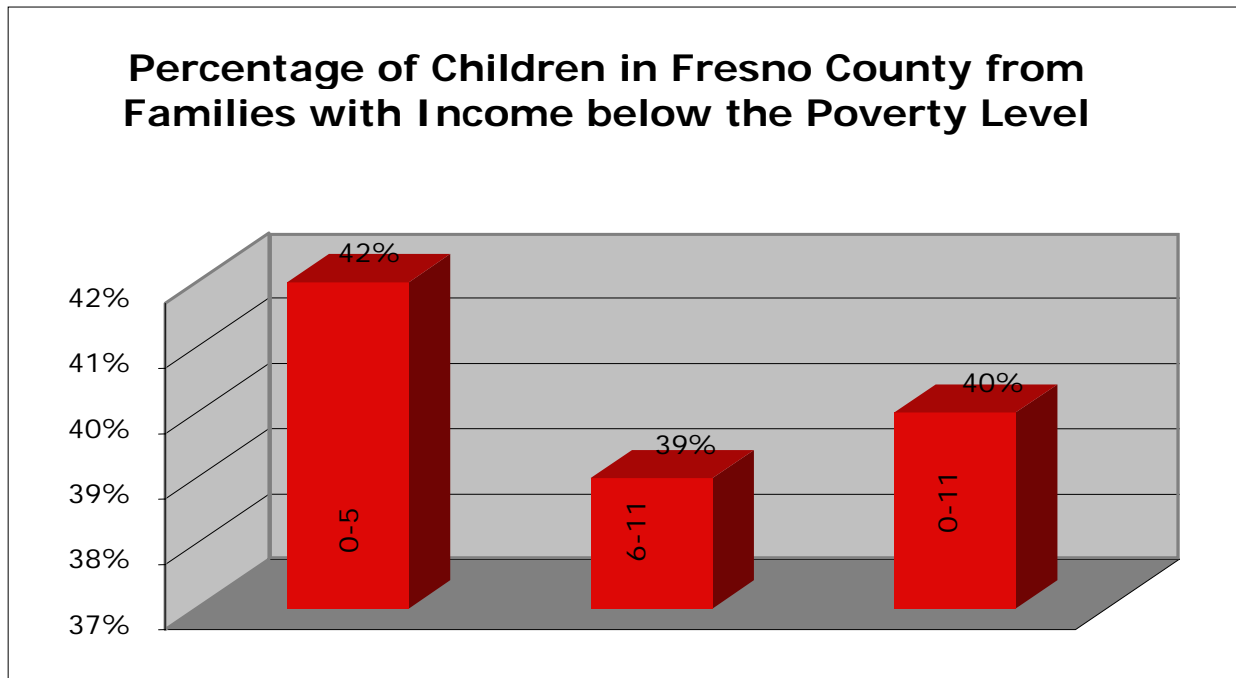

Number of Fresno County Children Age 0-11 Living in Poverty

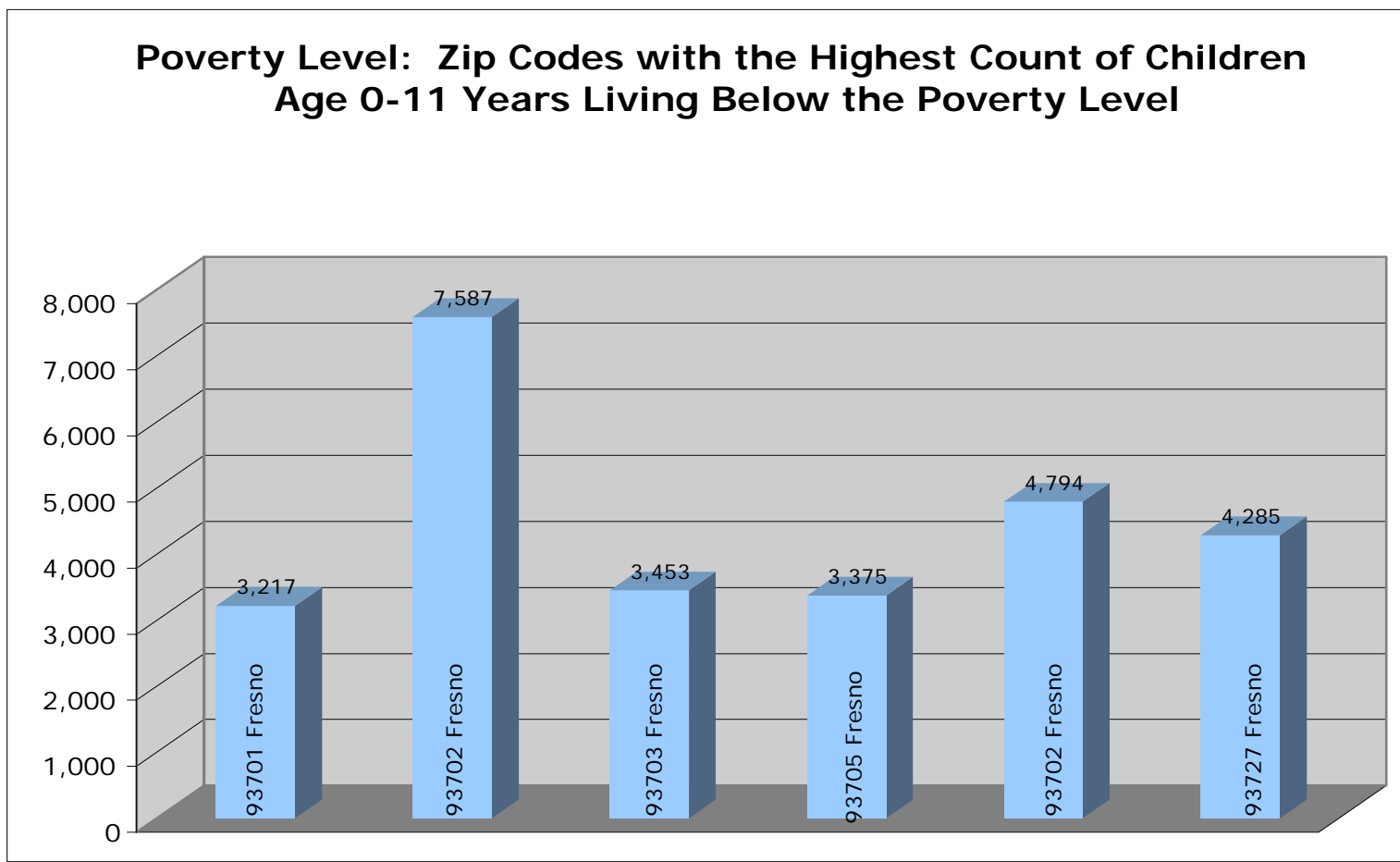
According to the 2000 U.S. Census, in Fresno County there were 26,909 children age 0-5 years, 29,320 children age 6-11 years and 56,229 children age 0-11 years from families whose annual income was less than the poverty level. This is illustrated in the graph below. In addition, the number of children from families whose annual income was below the poverty level for the zip codes with the highest count in Fresno County is illustrated in the graph on the following page. The number of children from families with an annual income below the poverty level is reported by zip code in the Fresno County Child Care Needs Assessment Report. Poverty was defined by the 2000 U.S. Census as total family income less than 75% of the State Median Income (SMI). In 2000, the California SMI was \$45,000; 75% of SMI = \$33,750.

The graph below illustrates the number of children age 0-11 years in Fresno County that were from families whose annual income was below the poverty level. Data for each zip code may be found in the complete Needs Assessment Report. The data indicates that countywide, nearly one-half of children ages 0-11 live in poverty. In some zip codes this percentage of children living in families with an annual income below the poverty level exceeds 50 percent.

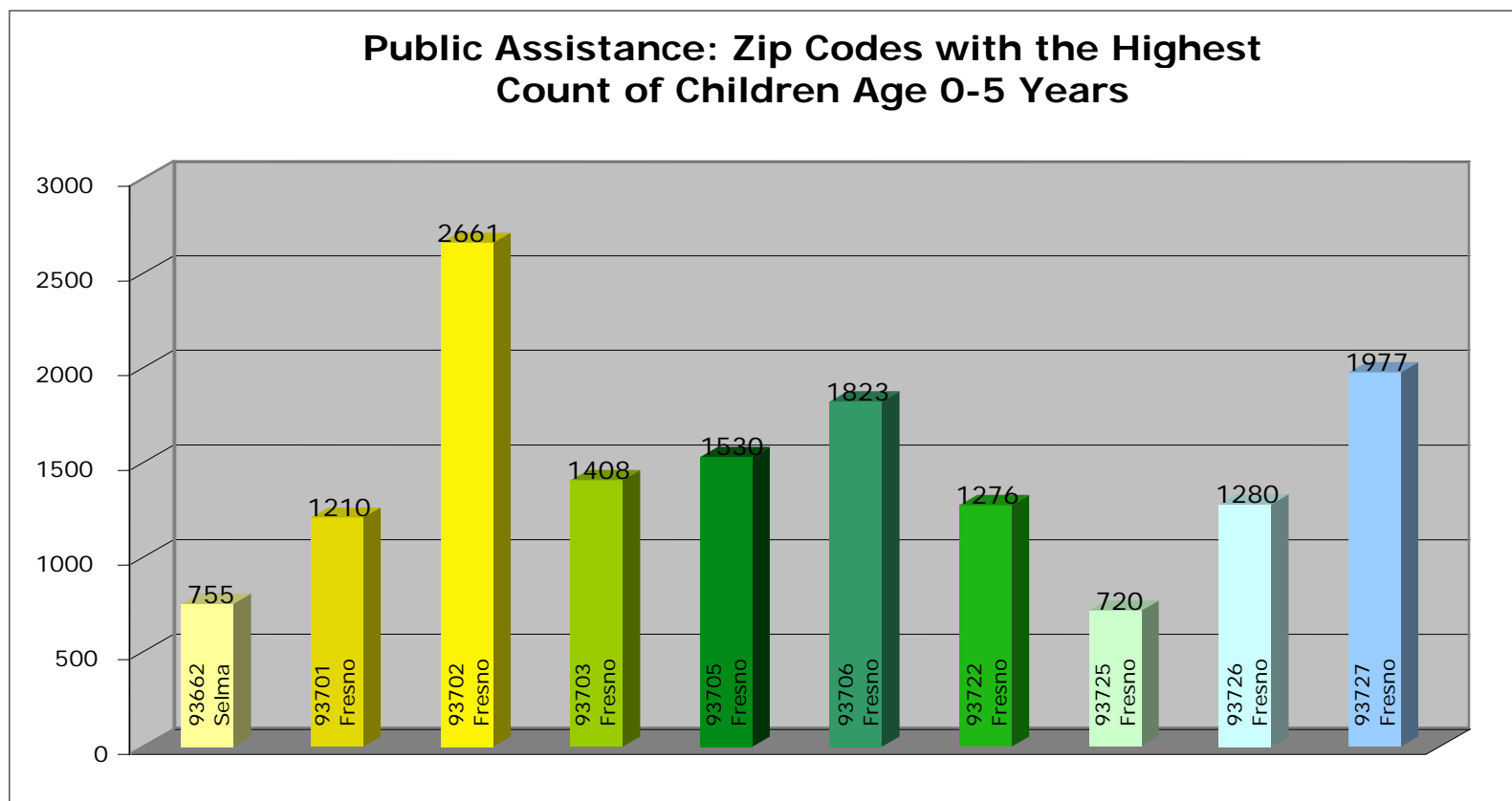

Number of Children Receiving Public Assistance

According to the California Department of Health Services, in 2004, 21,798+ children age 0-5 years in Fresno County received one or more types of public assistance. This represented approximately 33 percent of children in the county. The countywide average per zip code was 474 children age 0-5 years.

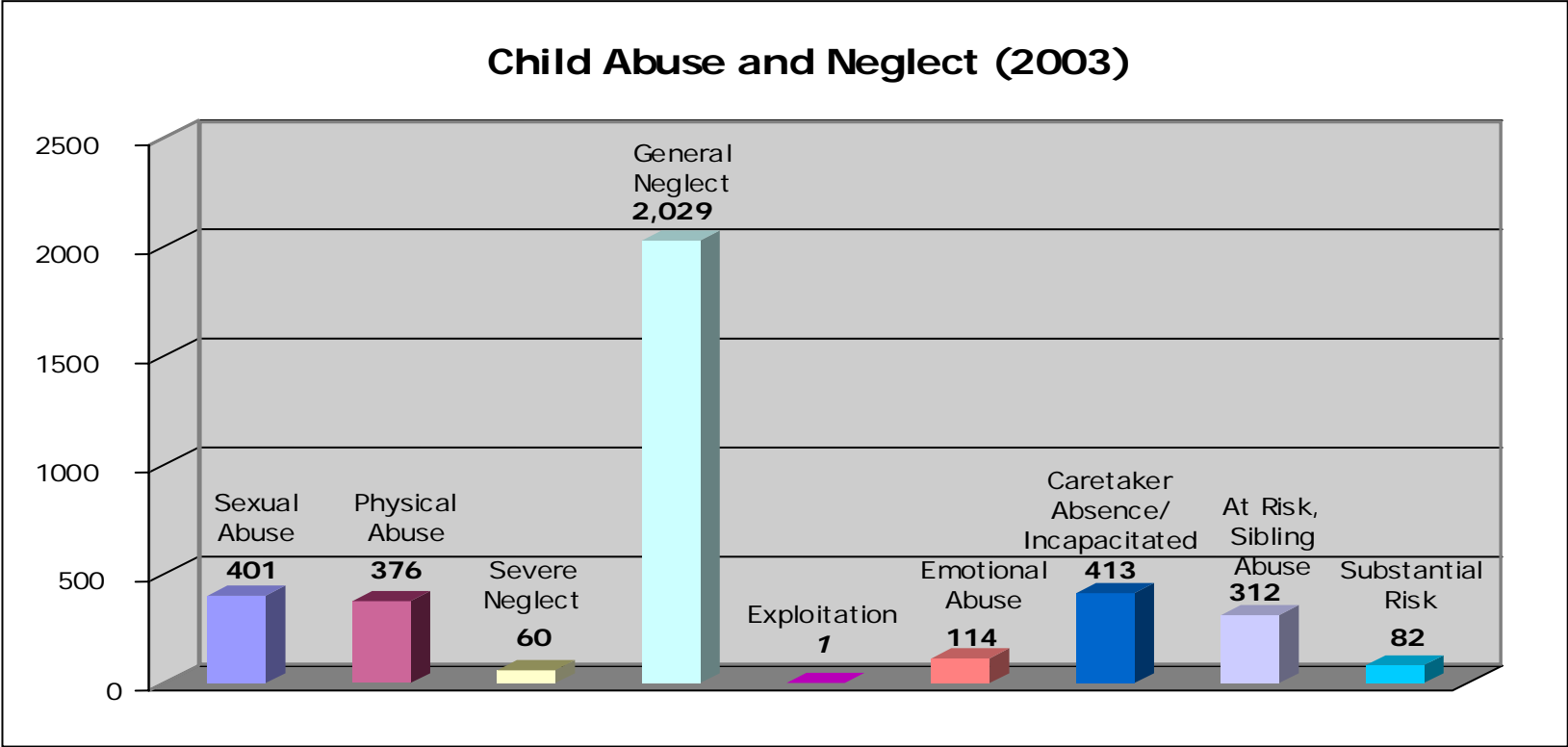
The graph below illustrates the number of children receiving some type of public assistance for zip codes with the highest counts.

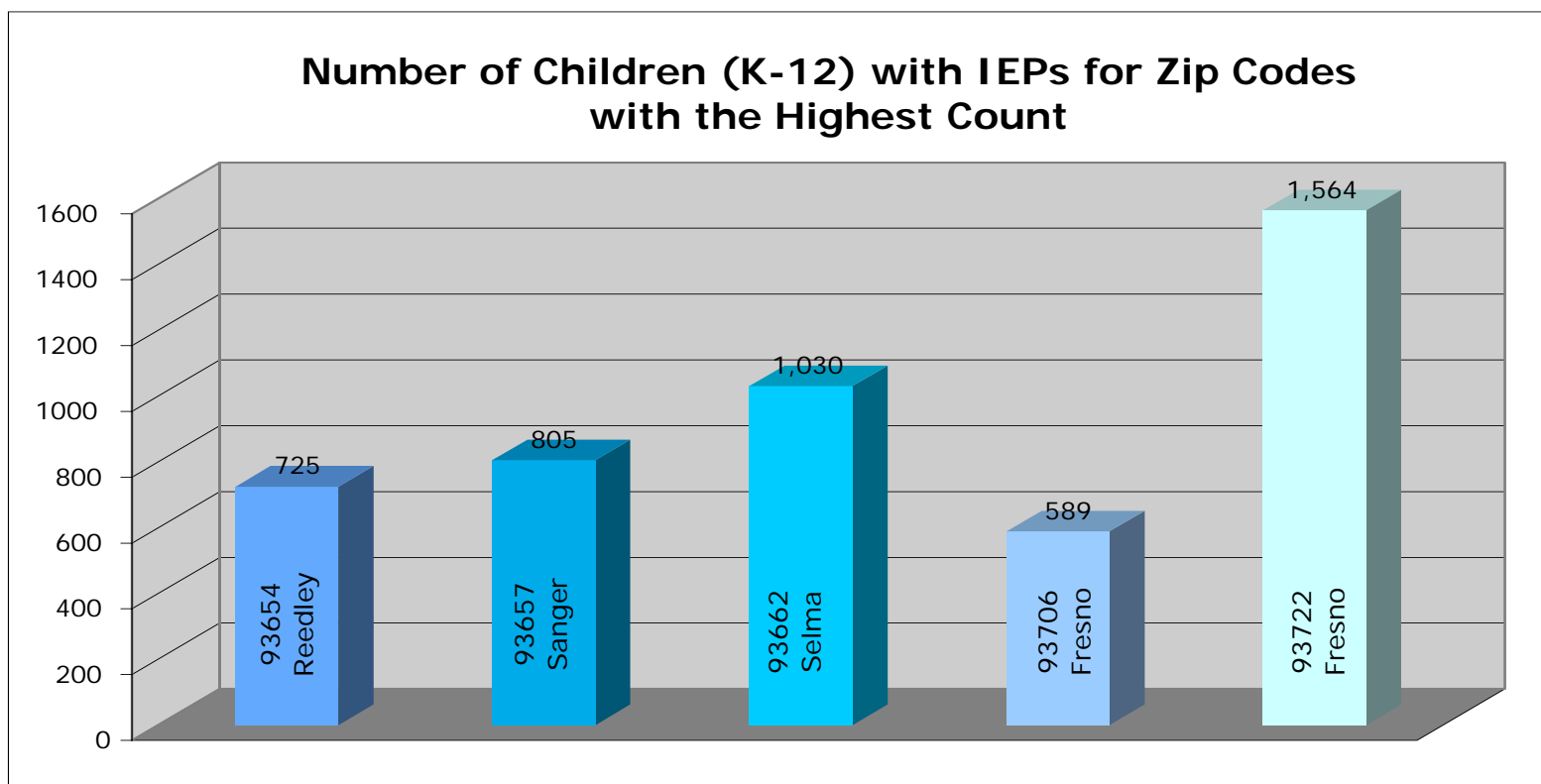

Children and Families with Special Needs

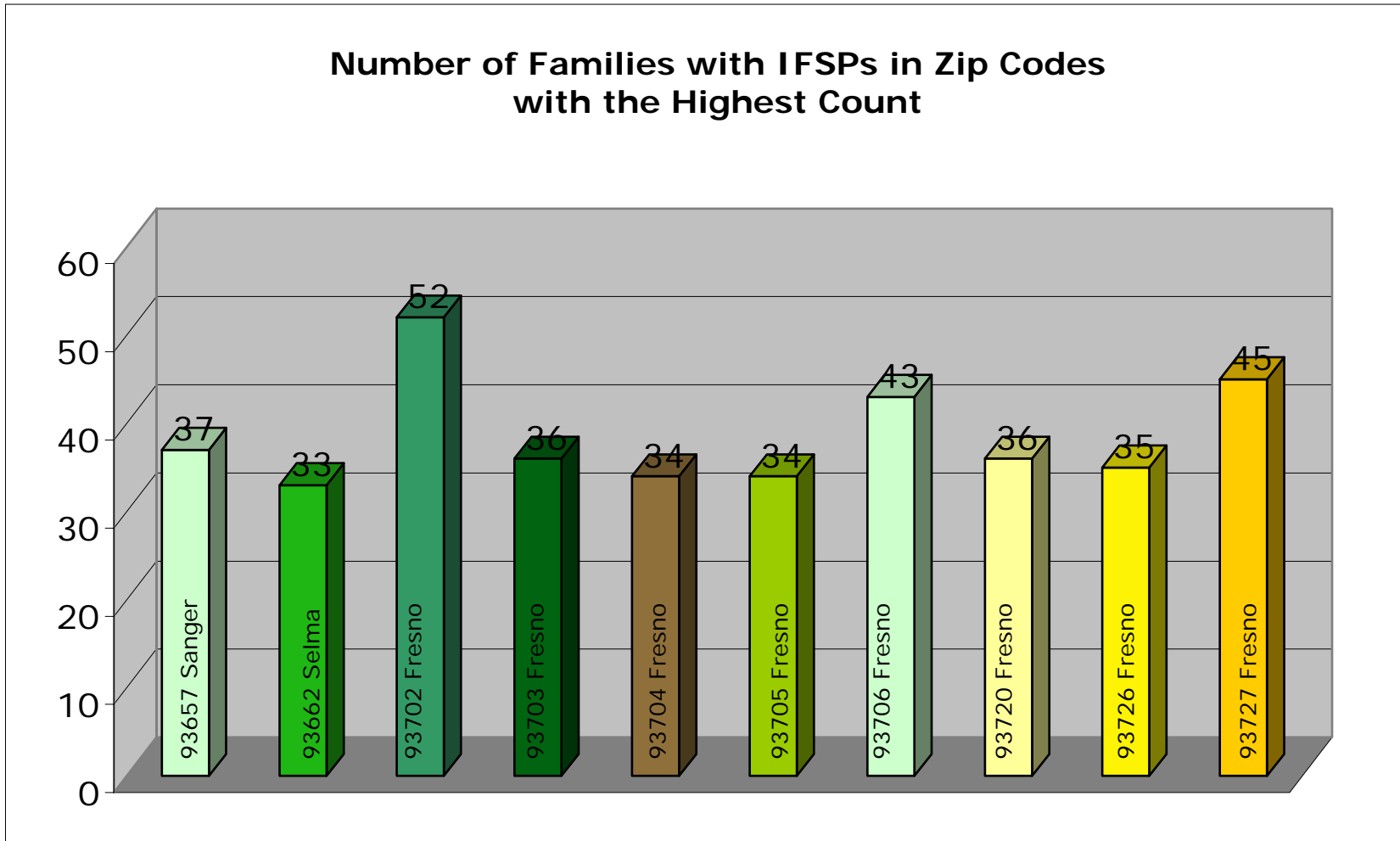
In 2004, 9,635 children in Fresno County schools had Individualized Educational Plans (IEP). This represented approximately 209 IEPs per zip code. For children age 0-11 years, approximately 6.86 percent had IEPs. In addition, 719 families countywide had Individualized Family Service Plans (IFSP). This represented approximately 16 families per zip code. Information regarding IEPs and IFSPs for all zip codes in Fresno County may be found in the complete Fresno County Child Care Needs Assessment Report.

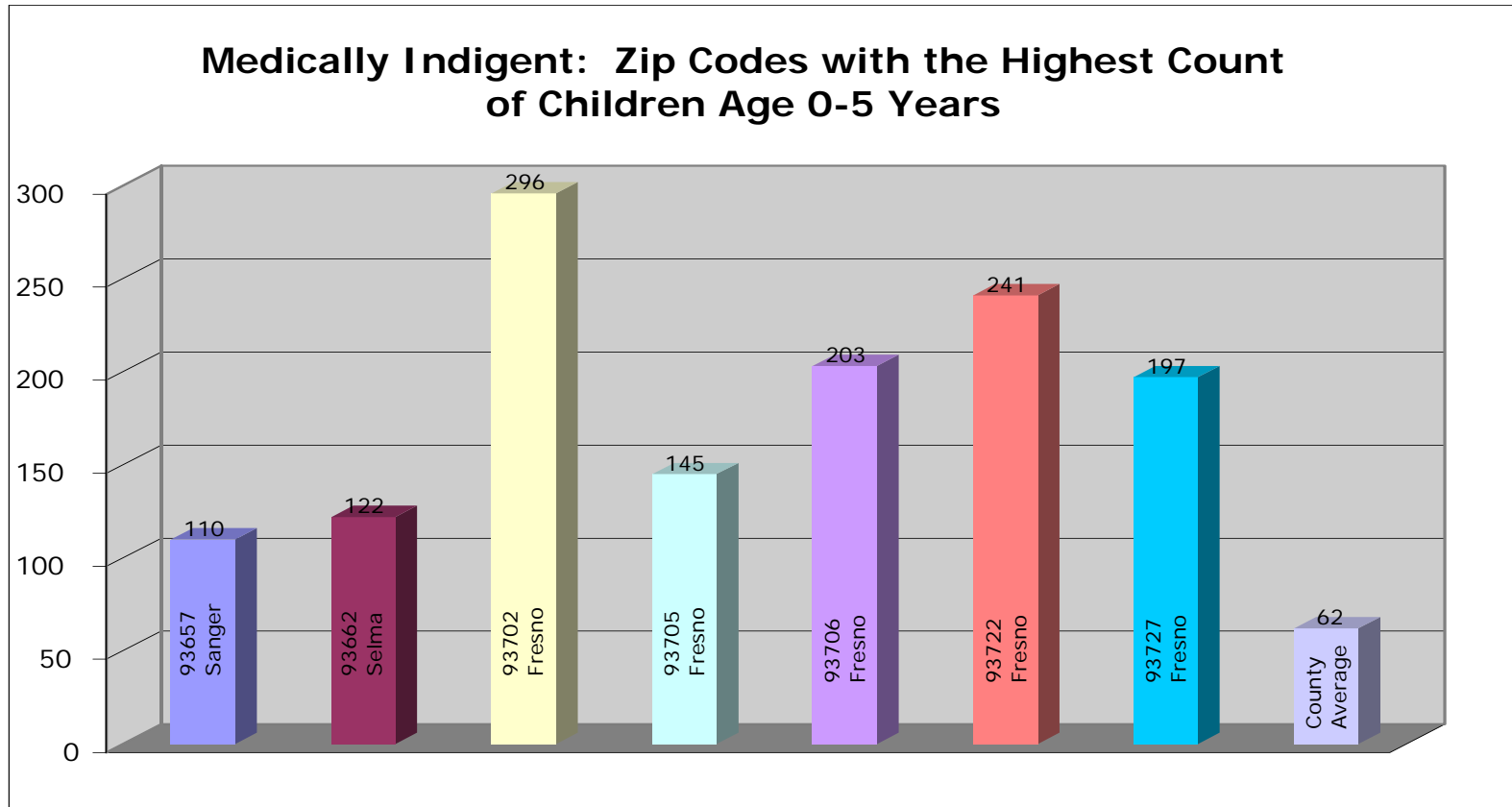

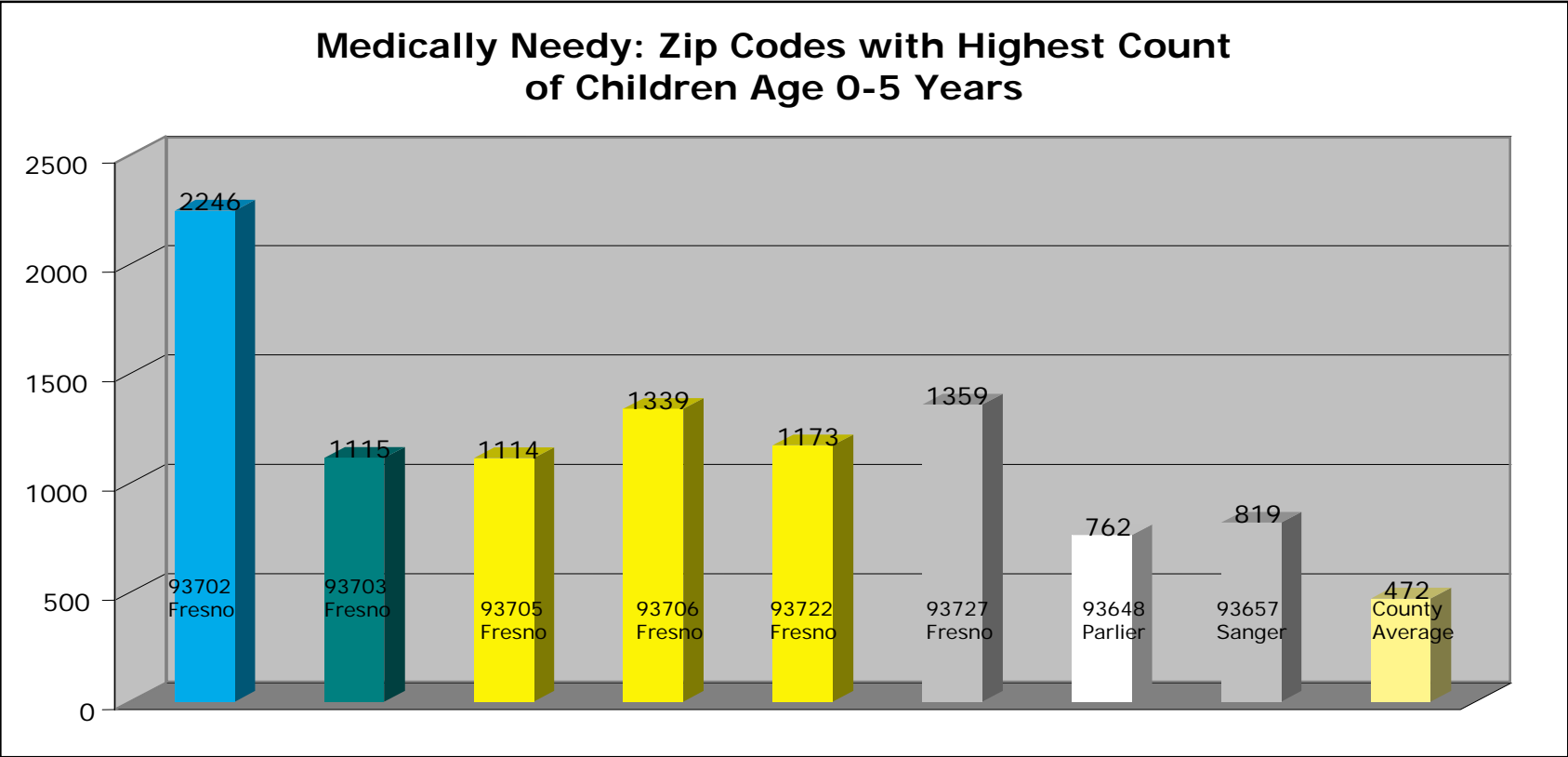

The countywide average across all zip codes was 472 children.



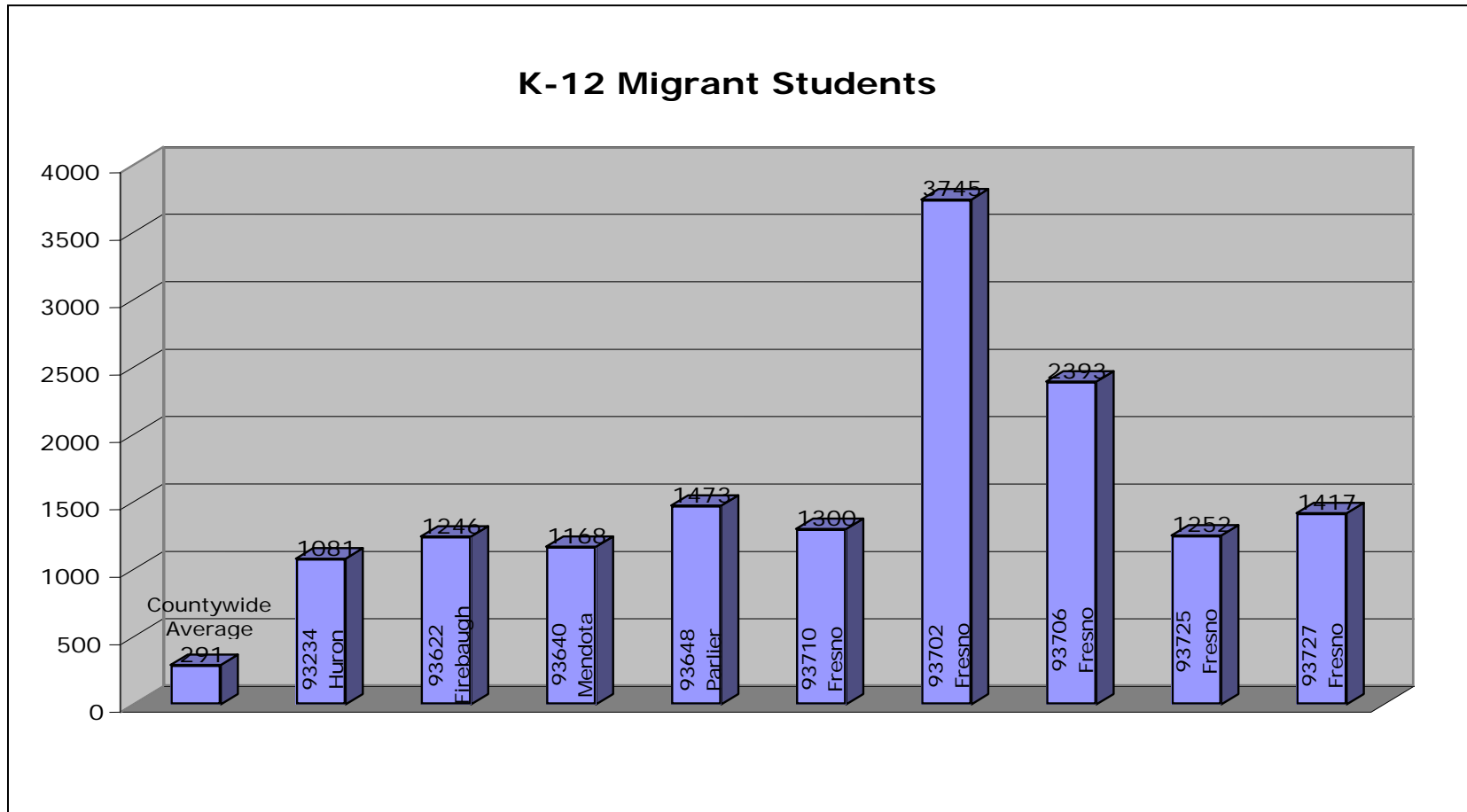

Migrant Students Attending Fresno County Schools

In 2003-04 there were over 31,000 students that qualified for the K-12 Migrant Education Program in Fresno County. For seven out of 35 school districts in Fresno County, the number of migrant children attending exceeded 50 percent of the student enrollment. In addition, there were approximately 350 students that participated in the Fresno County Migrant Head Start Program. However, because of the migratory nature of the families of these children (i.e., frequently moving with work related to agriculture), the number of children varied from month to month. The numbers cited in this report may be considered as average for the school year. More accurate monthly counts of migrant students may be obtained from the Fresno County Office of Education. Additional data regarding migrant and other students may be accessed from the California Department of Education. Data for all zip codes (based on school location) for K-12 migrant students may be found in the complete Fresno County Child Care Needs Assessment Report. The data illustrated in the graph on the next page is for those schools (represented by city and zip code where the school is located) with the highest count of K-12 migrant students.



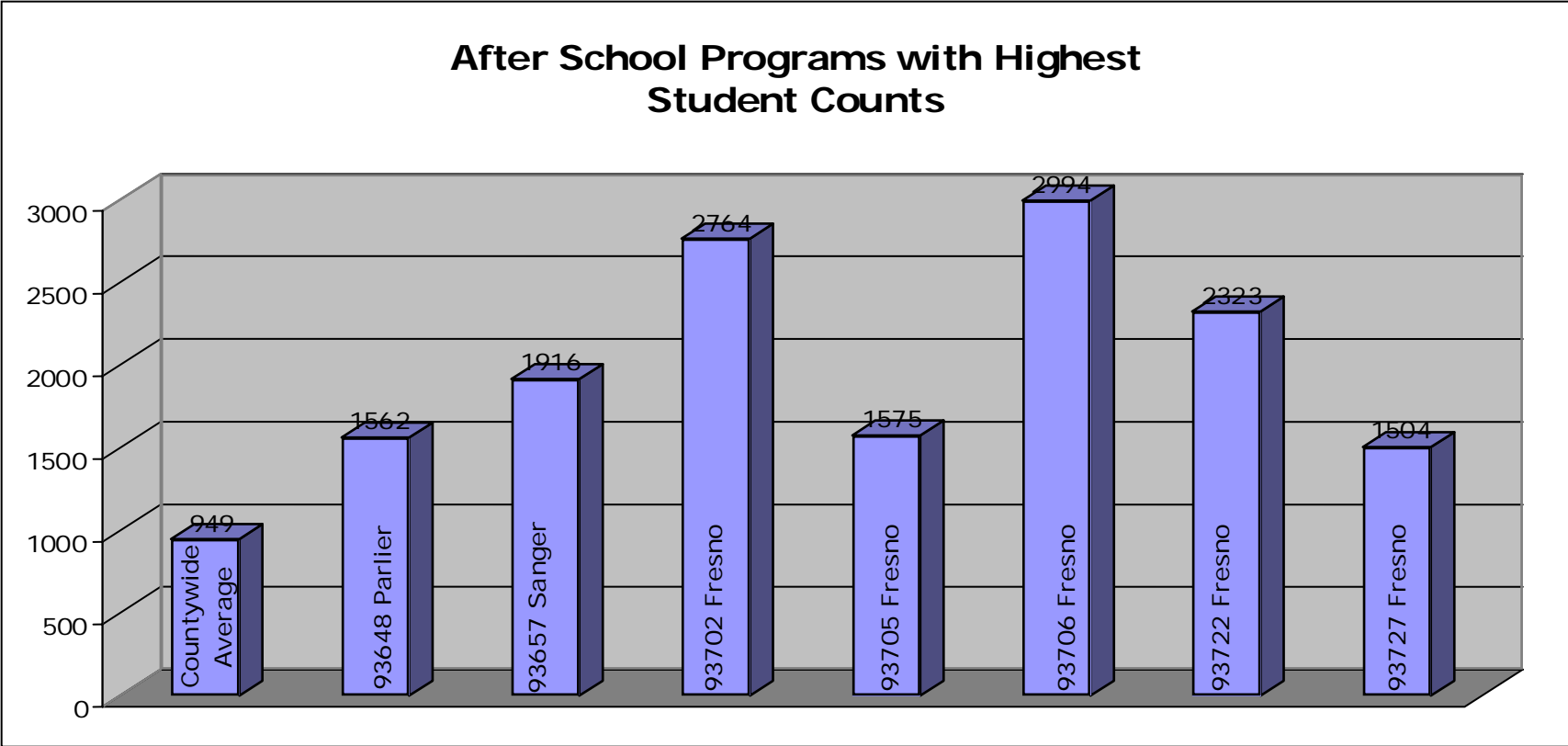
Migrant Students Attending Fresno County Schools (continued)

After-School Program Enrollment

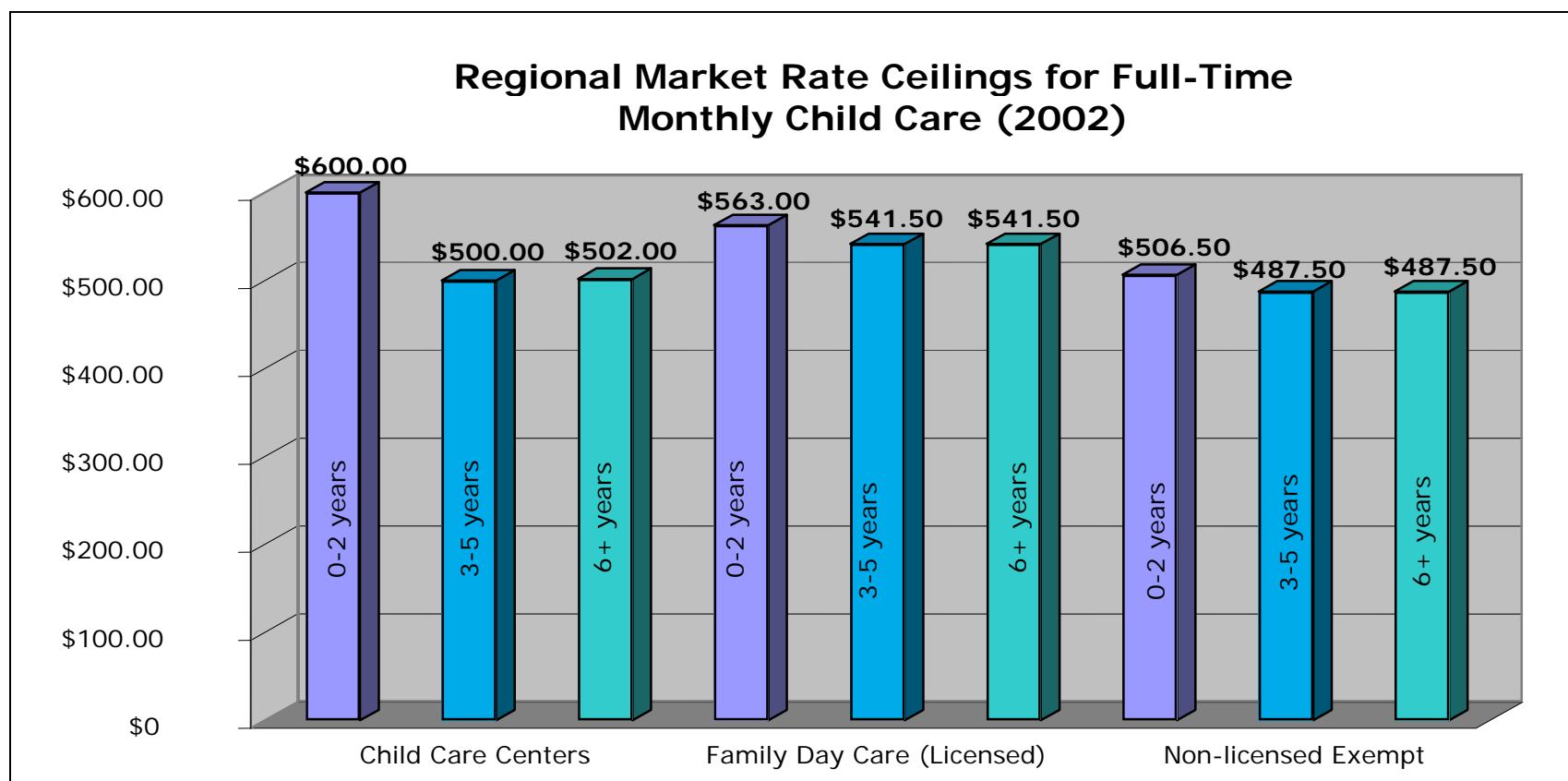

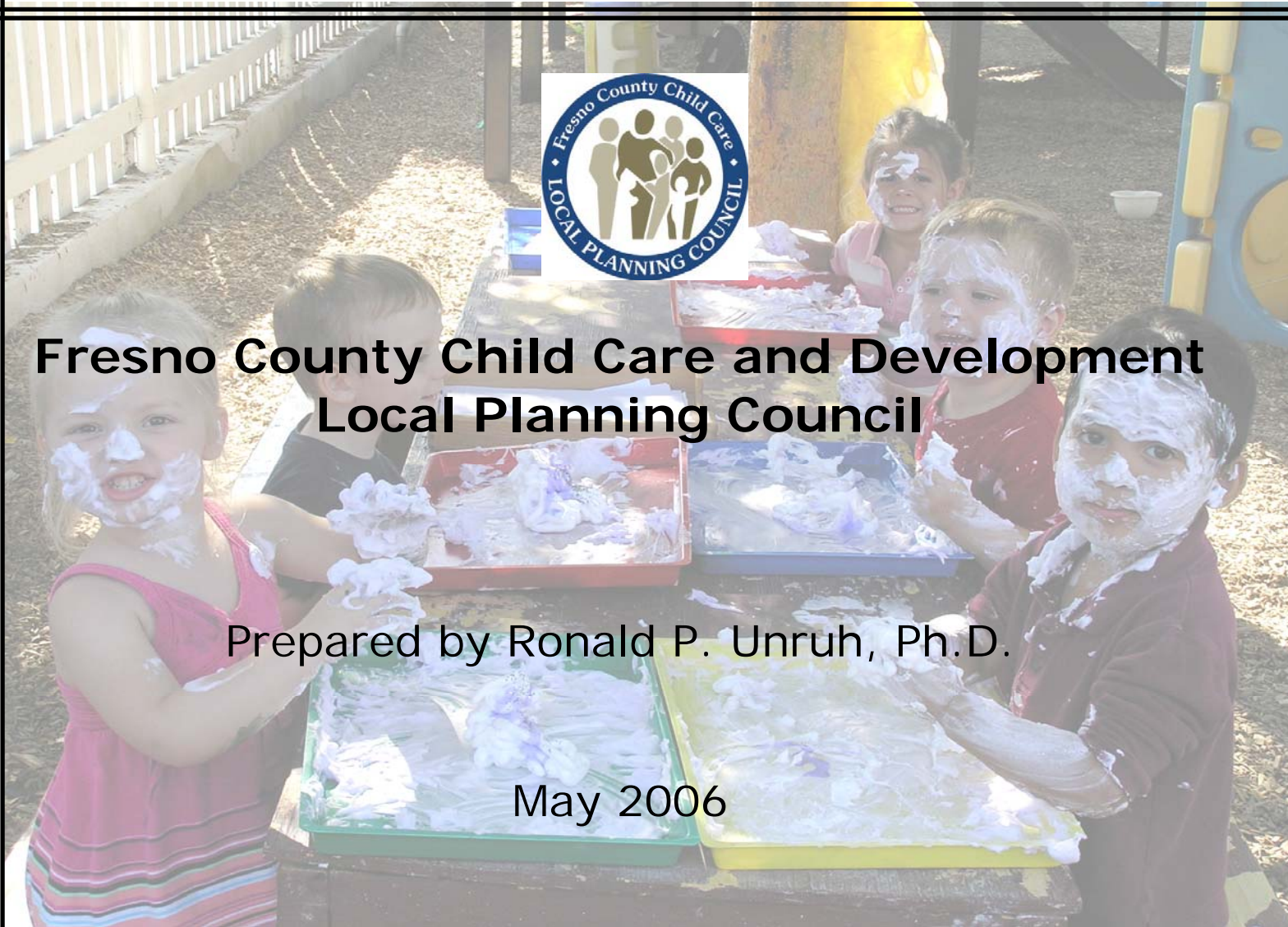
Regional Market Rate Ceilings for Monthly Full-Time Child Care

2= Second highest (Total shortage of 500-999 slots).
3= Third highest (Total shortage of 1-499 slots).

Cutoff points for **rural** areas were:
1= Highest (Total shortage of 200 or more slots).
2= Second highest (Total shortage of 1-199 slots).
3= Third highest (Total shortage of 0 slots).

*Number of "slots" refers to full time equivalent openings (not the number of children). For example, a program may have 10 FTE slots that are filled by 20 children, 10 in the morning and 10 in the afternoon.

Much of the data related to child care needs may be found in the Child Care Priorities Report. This report contains data on the following variables for each zip code: number of children, number of children living in families with income below the poverty level, number of State Preschool slots, Head Start slots and other program slots, total licensed child care capacity, child care slots shortage and priorities for child care needs.

Due to the changing nature of the population in Fresno County all variables are in a state of flux, including zip codes. First, the U.S. Census reports data in Zip Code Tabulation Areas (ZCTA) which are areas similar but not always identical to zip codes. Second, with an increasing population, new zip codes have been added to some areas. These factors, plus the fact that some data included in this report is five years old, must be considered when interpreting these results.

The data in this report was derived from multiple sources. For each variable, the source of data is reported. The criteria for each data source was that each was to provide recent, comprehensive and fair information regarding child care needs in Fresno County for each zip code. Source(s) of data are provided so program managers, developers and grant writers may obtain more up-to-date information. These are not static numbers, but change daily based on the increasing population and changing characteristics of Fresno County. Therefore, the source of data and websites are essential so that the most recent data can be used in writing proposals and creating programs.

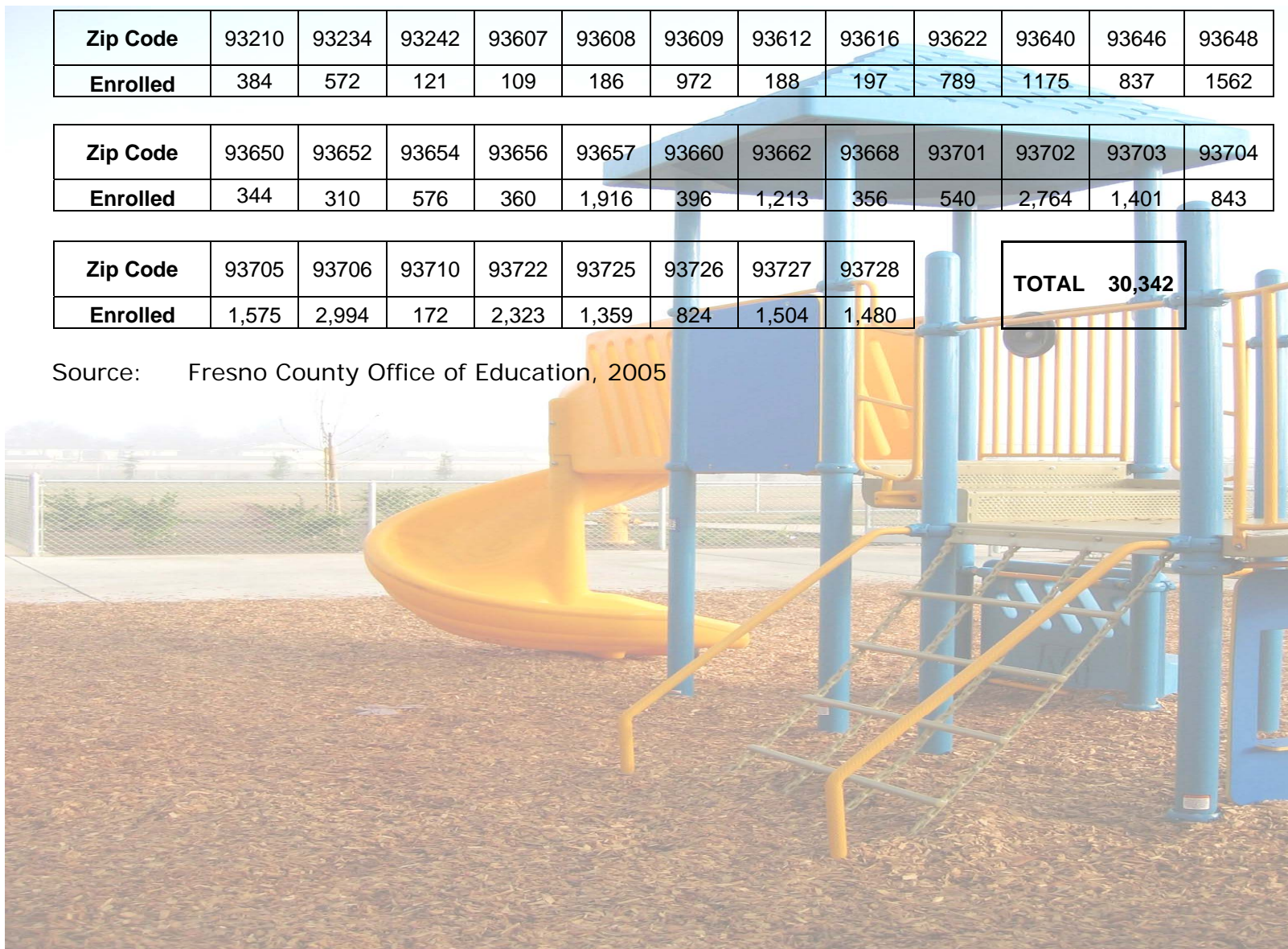
